The global pulses market was valued at USD 70.17 billion in 2023 and is expected to grow at a CAGR of 5.20% from 2024-2032¹. I hope to bring supply chain solutions to the board, as well as relationships that will help to expand the production and consumption of pulses. I plan to be highly involved in interacting with government officials and R&D to help promote the growth and use of pulses worldwide," says Van Pevenage.
